Match the Headlines

THEME: ANY

LANGUAGE: ANY (GERMAN)

STANDARD(S): COMMUNICATION COMPARISONS

1.2 4.1

Time Frame:

15 - 20 minutes

Materials Needed:

- Short articles from newspapers or magazines with headlines removed (samples in German provided; the subject matter, length, and level of difficulty should be appropriate to the age, proficiency level, and interests of the students)
- Headlines from articles printed on another piece of paper (samples in German provided)

Description of Task:

Pre-reading task:

Each student is given copies of approximately 5 short newspaper articles on one page with the headlines removed. Students are asked to skim the newspaper articles and predict possible headlines for the articles, thereby identifying the themes. They should jot down the strategies they use to make their predictions (e.g., use of cognates).

During reading task:

The students are given a handout with the 5 headlines and, in pairs, they are asked to match the headlines with the corresponding articles. The students are to underline all words and phrases in the articles that have helped them to complete this matching task.

Level:

Novice-High to Intermediate-Low

Purpose:

To skim for gist and key concepts

Communicative Function(s):

Referential: skimming text for gist

Language Structure(s):

Cognates; other structures being studied can be emphasized depending upon articles selected

Cultural Aspects:

Articles that focus on a particular theme could be used for this activity

Modalities:

Reading

Post-reading task:

After the matching task is completed, two pairs of students join together to form small groups to discuss (in English) their work, compare their answers (both the predictions and the matching), and reflect on the strategies they used to complete the predicting and matching tasks. Finally, the small groups share (in English) their strategies with the whole class. The teacher shows a transparency containing the accurate matches, and students discuss their answers.

Assessment:

The during-reading matching activity acts as an assessment of comprehension. The teacher should pay close attention to the issues that arise during the small group and large class discussion of strategies. This will help the teacher to assess reading processes; what are students focusing on as they attempt to complete the task?

Extensions:

Suggestions for adapting the task for various levels:

For beginning levels:

- Very short and simple articles along with headlines shown on the bottom half of the handout can be used.
- Topics of the articles can differ significantly to facilitate the matching activity.

For advanced levels:

- Students can be given longer articles that focus on more difficult themes or controversial issues.
- Articles that are similar in content can be selected, making the matching activity more complex.
- Students can be asked to write a couple of questions in the target language about some of the articles.
- Students can be given the articles and be asked to write the headlines; alternatively, students can be given the headlines and some key

vocabulary and structures and then be asked to create a short newspaper article to fit the headline.

Other extensions:

As a class, students can make posters of the five most commonly used skimming or reading comprehension strategies and display in the classroom. The poster can be created in English or the target language.

Cultural extensions:

- Students can be asked to locate on a map the cities that are mentioned in the articles.
- The class can discuss what the articles communicate about cultural attitudes with respect to the particular theme or topic chosen. They can compare and contrast target and native cultural attitudes as reflected in newspaper articles about the same topic.
